Michael's Musings

October in the life of the church is a time to celebrate God's blessings. One way we do that is by considering what we have been given by God and deciding on how much we will keep and how much we will return. In this time of COVID-19, social unrest, chaos and darkness, YOU are Christ's Light. Hence our theme for this year's Stewardship Campaign, "Shining Out Light" from the saying of Jesus in Matthew 5:14-15: "You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house."

What does being a light mean? It means placing our hope in God when all around us there are few signs of hope. It means embodying that hope in the world. Genuine hope is contagious. One way we do that is by maintaining our generosity. Hopeful people—people of the light—are generous people. It is why Jesus always focused on the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of God (or the church) to receive.

With all of this in mind, your elected elders encourage all of us to prayerfully respond to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give back in 2021?"

Guest preacher, Dick Ramsey will kick off our Stewardship Season this year on October 11. It will culminate at the end of worship on Dedication Sunday, October 25 by which you are asked to make your financial commitment to our church's ministries either by returning a self-addressed stamped pledge card that you will receive in the mail or by going to Trinity's web site and clicking on "Make a Pledge." The pledge card will be mailed to you with a letter the week of October 12. When you turn in your pledge, our financial secretary, Ann Bouchard, will be the only person to see that pledge. From then on, she will also be the only person with access to that information.

I thank you in advance for the prayerful consideration that you will give to matching engendering hope and letting your light shine in faithful response to Christ's call.



Stewardship Season begins October 11, and our theme is Shining Our Light. That theme, taken from the fifth chapter of Matthew's Gospel, speaks to us as individuals and as a community of faith

Individually, each of us is called to make sure we are letting God's light shine through our work, our friendships, our service and our giving. We are called to be light bearers. It is a powerful calling.

As a faith community, Trinity is called to shine the light of Christ through our worship, welcoming, pastoral care and ministry to the wider community. How we use our time, talents, and treasure determines how brightly we are shining our light.

Rev. Dick Ramsey, Pastor Emeritus of First Presbyterian-Columbia, will preach at Trinity on the October 11 with Rev. Stanfield serving as liturgist. Stewardship materials, including the proposed 2021 budget (in narrative form) and a pledge card, will be mailed to you on October 12, On October 25, we will dedicate our 2021 pledges to God during our livestream worship service.

Due to the pandemic, you are asked to mail your 2021 pledge card to the church office or go to the church website, click on the "Give" button at the top of the page, then complete the online pledge card. All pledges made this way will be sent directly to our Financial Secretary, Ann Bouchard, and your information will be completely confidential.

Please join us in giving thanks for God's light shining in our lives and into our community through the mission and ministry of Trinity.

Need reasons to give to Trinity? Here are just a few:

-Trinity provides a Christian witness unlike any other in Columbia. In a world where religion has become a symbol of division, Trinity is a place of loving inclusion that genuinely welcomes people no matter who they are. -Trinity understands and values being part of the larger church. Trinity is committed to being one of the largest per capita givers to the presbytery, synod and general assembly in the whole Presbyterian denomination! It is one of only a handful of churches in the synod that contributes to all four of the yearly special offerings.

-Trinity values the spread of the good news of God's love beyond the walls of this church giving fifteen to twenty percent of its offerings to local and worldwide ministries dedicated to things like alleviating hunger, caring for neglected children, providing clothing and housing to those without, disaster relief, repatriating refugees, and peacemaking.

September Session Meeting Highlights

 Secretary Lily Chan announced her retirement from Trinity effective December 31, 2020. Lily has served the church for 31 years. Plans to honor her faithful, long-time service are being made. Ann Bouchard will assume Lily's responsibilities and continue managing the church finances.



- 2. The 2021 Stewardship Campaign begins Sunday, October 11. Rev. Dick Ramsey, Pastor Emeritus of First Presbyterian, will preach that morning. Pledge Dedication Sunday is set for October 25.
- Rev. Stanfield will lead three officer training classes in October for newly elected elders. The new elders will also attend the session retreat in November.
- 4. An adult Sunday School class will be offered this fall via Zoom at 9:30 a.m. beginning September 27. The Christian Education Committee is exploring options for resuming the Confirmation Class begun last winter and for providing Sunday morning instruction for younger children.
- 5. A total of \$775—\$300 from the Operating Budget and \$475 from member donations—was sent to the Festival of Sharing.
- 6. The Sunday After Church (Zoom) Fellowship gathering is going well. Hosting duties are being managed by 7-8 Trinity members.
- The church website will be undergoing some design changes in hopes of making it even more userfriendly.
- 8. This year's session retreat will be held via Zoom on Saturday, November 14, led by Missouri Union Presbyter, Deborah Boucher-Payne.
- At a special, called meeting on September 28, session will be reviewing a webinar on COVID-19 and guidelines for church reopening led by Lisa Allgood, transitional Executive Presbyter of the Presbytery of Cincinnati and trained immunocytochemist.

Trinity Library Book Highlight By Marianne Fues

An On-Going Imagination: A Conversation about Scripture, Faith, and the Thickness of Relationship by Walter Brueggeman and Clover Reuter Beal

This book derives from a series of long conversations between Walter Brueggeman and Clover Reuter Beal, his student and long time friend. Edited by Timothy Beal, the Beals believe that the conversations share insights and reflections not found in Brueggeman's written works.

Beal and Brueggeman begin by working through the timeline of Brueggeman's life and development as a scholar and theologian. From the therapy of personal self to interpreting the text and the contradictions in the biblical text are all tensions for a preacher to negotiate in a congregation. Does God act & intervene in history? If not, then what is the point of prayer? Re: Enlightenment – conservatives compartmentalize and liberals mumble. So says Brueggeman. Read and continue learning from their conversations.

You are welcome to bring food items for the barrel anytime during that period. If we still are not open for in-person meetings, please come during church office hours so that someone can let you in or receive your donations.

The most needed food items are peanut butter, canned tuna, canned chicken, beans, canned fruits and canned vegetables. Please, no glass containers or homemade items.

If you would like to make a monetary donation, you may send a check to the church by <u>Sunday</u>, <u>November 15th</u>, writing Food Drive on the 'memo' line, or make a payment online by that date at the church website.

Please remember that, according to the Food Bank, for every \$10 gift they receive, they can acquire \$210 worth of groceries.

Wardrobe Now Open: The Wardrobe has re-opened on a limited basis. It is open for shopping and donations on Wednesdays from 11-2 and Saturdays from 9-12 with a crew of five. Customers will not be allowed in the door without a mask. Only 20 shoppers will be allowed in the building at any one time. 
