Michael's Musings

The Advent season is one that touches on the gift of divine anticipation. It is this kind of anticipation that Isaiah lifts up to God's people who are in exile and without hope. The message? "Things are terrible but God is about to make something great happen and it is not going to be like anything we have experienced before. It is something that is too wonderful to describe. Our current lives are a desert in comparison. And when God does this thing, it will be like rivers appearing spontaneously in that desert."

It is like the feeling of falling in love when you thought such things were not possible for you again. It is one that makes all other feelings pale in comparison. I remember having that unusual feeling at times near Christmas when I was a child. It is the feeling that all may not be right with the world now, but it will be perfectly, soon, at Christmas. Such a feeling is pure and unadulterated; it cannot be conjured or controlled, although many of us consciously or unconsciously attempt to do both around this time.

People who do advertising know this and do their best to link it to shopping for just the right gift or planning for the perfect meal. Yet, having out-of-this-world expectations for an event that we organize and create can actually suck the real possibilities available to us right out of the event. High expectations specific to one human event such as Christmas Day lead to a feeling of emptiness commensurate with the higher the expectation. The gift of the pandemic, if I can be so bold to name it as such, is that it can take away the possibility of such false expectations. It gives us an opportunity perhaps to experience the story of Christmas in a fresh new way.

It is always our wish that we, and our loved ones, will be happy at Christmas. Perhaps we would do well to remember that the word "happy" derives from the verb "to happen." Happiness then derives from observing and finding peace with whatever happens. It is good to get in touch with the divine anticipation about which Isaiah speaks. However, in the end, it is not something we can muster no matter how hard we try but is simply to be received as a gift when it comes. I pray that gift will come to you this Christmas.

Trinity Library -**Book Highlight**

One Damned Good Horse : Stories, Wit, and Wisdom bv Mel West

Mel West is a familiar name to Columbians and to Trinity. The Trinity Library has several books pertaining to PET (Personal Energy Transportation), which are mobility devices. This book contains Mel West stories and is a good read for these times. Read about "The sage of the tar-bottomed, barefoot boys," heated seats, and Midwest farmers and their ingenuity - "If you need it and don't have it, improvise." A threshing run is a good way to build community, develop community and action. A handshake deal is a deal, leave the world a better place than you found it, be an encourager - all part of Mel's philosophy. Being poor is a matter of choice - read how Mel explains this.

Mel relates that "In January after the October Festival, I took a gooseneck trailer and 10 beef heifers to the Sioux Heifer Project in Herrick, SD. The Trinity Presbyterian Church in Columbia had given generously to buy those heifers, so I took along two of their teenage boys to see the project." Who were the teenage boys??

Find this book and the PET books on the special shelf for newsletter features. Feel free to visit Trinity Library between 9:00 a.m. -3:00 p.m. Books can be checked out using the three ring binder on the desk in the main library and also in the children's library downstairs in Room 9. Remember that there are only one or two people in the building at a time so going to the library is easy.

Looking Ahead to 2021

This year has been a difficult one for everyone. Due to the coronavirus, activities in which we used to participate, without a second thought, now are either out of the question or require sometimes days of extra planning to carry out. The political and social divide in this country is the highest it has ever been – at least in my lifetime. Face to face contact with those we love - our biological family members that do not live in the same house and church family members that we use to see regularly has all but stopped.

Yet Trinity has remained ever faithful. We have found a way to have bible studies and Presbyterian Women and Session meetings and committee meetings and Sunday School. We have found a way to provide for Loaves and Fishes and the Wardrobe and the Food Bank and our four major yearly offerings. Most of all we have found a way to gather for live worship on Sundays, perhaps our strongest consistent connective tissue.

Under the circumstances we are continuing to serve faithfully, undaunted by viruses or politics or social unrest. In fact, Trinity has continued to be a place of hope and love and justice and grace in a time of hopelessness, hate, injustice, and blame.

Yet we cannot get around the fact that the lack of regular face to face contact represents a deep loss that affects us both individually and corporately. We feel it through grief and sadness. Our bodies ache for hugs and handshakes from our brothers and sisters in Christ. And for the first time in six years, we feel it in pledging for the coming year. Four weeks out from our Stewardship season, there are still a number of folks (about thirteen) who have not pledged that normally pledge, leaving us about \$35,000 short of our challenge mission budget for 2021 – a budget that represents only a modest 2.4% increase over the 2020 budget – most of which is tied to costs that are fixed and cannot be negotiated.

Contrary to what one might think, our expenses have not really been much less than they were before covid-19. In fact, ministry costs remain the same or slightly higher. But unless we hear from more of you who normally pledge or from those of you who have pledged who might consider pledging more, it looks as if the Session will need to do some fairly significant adjusting to the budget for 2021, cutting into those things that continue to help us remain connected.

If you have already pledged, thank-you! If you have not pledged, would you please consider offering a generous pledge for the coming year? If you need another pledge card, just call the church office; or go online to the church website and click on the "Give" menu item. There you will find a link to make your 2021 pledge.

May God continue to bless us in 2021.

Highlights of the Session Retreat and the Regular Meeting of Session



Session Retreat

♦ Current session members, elders-elect, and Financial Secretary Ann Bouchard met for the 2020 Session Retreat on Saturday, November 14 via Zoom. The morning session was led by Rev. Dr. Deborah Boucher-Payne, General Presbytery of Missouri Union Presbytery. During her presentation, "Ministry in a Liminal Season," participants were asked to respond to three ques-



tions: 1) Where do you see God at work during this liminal season? 2) What gives you hope? and 3) What are the advantages of our current situation? Elders were then introduced to and able to practice a new discernment process focused on the question "How to we engage in evangelism when we are not able to gather in person?"

♦ During the afternoon session of the retreat, Ann Bouchard presented a Zoom tutorial, elders-elect were examined for ordination/installation, and each session committee met in short breakout sessions to discuss the duties of the committee, work in progress, and meeting times.

Session Meeting

- ♦ Session met via Zoom for their regular stated meeting on Tuesday, November 17.
- ♦ Elder Bob Winkelmann presented an overview of the emergency procedures policy and discussed the duties of elders on Sunday mornings when in-person worship is taking place.
- ♦ The examinations of the elder-elect were sustained. Ordination/installation will take place on Sunday, January 3rd during worship.
- ♦ Financial Secretary Ann Bouchard presented the financial report. As of November 17, year-to-date income exceeds expenses by \$20,652. Ann anticipates that total expenses for 2020 will be approximately \$15,000 under budget.
- ♦ Ann reported that 2021 pledges received to date are about 8% lower than the total pledged for 2020. An additional \$34,000 is needed to meet the proposed budget for 2021. Program committees were asked to review their budget line items for next year for possible reductions. The Stewardship and Finance Committee will meet in early January to review the year-end financial report and make budget revisions as needed.
- ♦ Elder Clerk Karen Kennedy shared thank you notes received from Jubilee Partners for a \$400 donation and from the Boone County Clerk for partnering with the Election Commission for the November 3rd election. Moderator Stanfield noted that he had also received a note from one of the poll workers at Trinity thanking the church for their exceptional hospitality on Election Day.
- ♦ Session approved a request from Amanda Fues asking Trinity to serve as a Charter Organization for Pack 2 of the Boy Scouts. The request was approved for 2021.
- ♦ Plans are being made to honor retiring Secretary Lily Chan at the Annual Meeting of the Congregation on January 31, 2021.
- ♦ Elder Lake reported donations totaling \$820 for the Peace and Global Witness Offering received in October. Two hundred seventeen (217) pounds of food were collected during the Holiday Food Drive and \$635 in donations. The Christmas Joy Offering will be received on December 20.
- ♦ Session approved a request from the Worship Committee to celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion on Sunday, December 20th instead of Christmas Eve.
- ♦ Elder Bill Daly reported on the November 17 meeting of Missouri Union Presbytery. Outgoing Moderator Don Bay presented Moderator's awards to Rev. Stanfield and to First Presbyterian member Chris Bouchard for their outstanding service to the presbytery this year. Rev. Stanfield serves as the Chair of the Commission on Ministry, and Elder Bouchard serves as Treasurer for the presbytery.


